This week's shortages: Tinned fruit, Tinned vegetables, Packet noodles. Tinned tuna fish.

There are two pilgrimages to Lourdes by Jumbulance in 2024 from Shrewsbury departing from Wirral and Chester. A Jumbulance is literally a Jumbo-Ambulance. It has seven beds on board, spacious seating, an accessible toilet and kitchen. We can take very sick or disabled pilgrims including those needing palliative care including cancer, MND, MS, stroke, etc. We stay in a four star hotel with excellent facilities to care for them and recruit a team of nurses and helpers to do so. The experience for younger helpers is good for the CV, especially those considering a career in health or social care. We all do a DBS. Everyone must be COVID vaccinated. The dates are Thu 30th May to Sat 8th June and Thu 15th to Sat 24th August he cost is £1,095 and, as a charity, we are all asked to pay. However, nurses and young helpers under 25 in FTE, pay half. We do fund raising to help support those who cannot afford the full amount. Travel Insurance is available at just £70, which is a snip for those with multiple health problems!

The Diocese has asked that we start the process of renewing the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks for all parishioners that require one for their role as a parish volunteer. Working from the current list supplied by the Diocese you will shortly receive an email, text or letter from me inviting you to start the process of renewing your DBS. If you receive a request and are no longer volunteering at St Mary's, please let me know and I will amend our records accordingly.

If you do not currently hold a DBS check for your volunteer role but want to check whether you may need one, please contact me by email/phone as above.

If you currently run a group/activity with volunteers assisting you that need DBS checks, it would be appreciated if you would contact me with a list of your active volunteer helpers and their email addresses so that we don't miss anyone from the DBS renewal process.

New collection envelopes will be available at all masses on the 23rd, 24th March.

Also, as the tax year 2023/24 will be coming to an end on 5th April, the Parish will then undertake the process of claiming back the tax on Gift Aided donations. FURTHER THREAT TO THE UNBORN OF ABORTION UP TO BIRTH In the next couple of weeks an attempt is to be made to widely decriminalise abortion up to the birth. This is a further assault on the sanctity of human life in our society. This extreme amendment to the Criminal Justice Bill is being made by Diana Johnson MP and parliamentarians will be under pressure to support the amendment on grounds of compassion for mothers who seek to abort their unborn child beyond the legal limits. The effect would be to withdraw legal protection from the unborn. It is important to make our voice heard in support of the unborn child. Please contact your Member of Parliament to ask that they oppose the decriminalization of abortion up to birth (Insert name and e-mail or postal address of your local Member of Parliament). The Right to Life website has details under 'Take Action' which enables you to find and contact your MP directly and the website of the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children has helpful information under 'Resources.' The Right to Life website also has details of an alternative amendment by Caroline Ansell MP to reduce the legal limit for abortion from 24 to 22 weeks on the basis of the increased survival rates for babies being born at 22 and 23 weeks. We cannot doubt the impact which your email or letter will have in making known opposition to decriminalizing abortion up to birth and in support of the value
