The new sets of Offertory Envelopes have arrived. Although you do not need them until 11th April, they will be available to collect for the next two weekends. They will be given out at the end of all weekend Masses. Do not attempt to help yourself (danger of cross-contamination), they will be handed to you. If you do not currently attend Mass but have a family member who does, please ask them to collect yours Please remember to social distance if you have to queue. We will attempt to deliver any remaining boxes after Easter (We hope you have updated your address on our parish records, if not let Molly know asap) Do not start using the new envelopes until 11th April.

The booking process is proving very complicated, even before it opens. Bear in mind that we have to reserve places for stewards, cleaners, readers, musicians and servers and their families, all of whom are essential to the Liturgy We are certain to be overbooked, so please do not complain if you don't get what you want. You can watch all except 9.00 am Sun on line. If you think the system is unfair, you are welcome to have a go at running it next time. We hope, however, that there won't be a next time!

Thank you those of you who have continued to join us, in person or online. We hope that, with falling infection rates, more of you will feel confident enough to return to Mass. This week we will continue to have a public Mass every weekday. Many thanks to the stewards who have made this possible. There is still no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for the time being. Please ensure when you leave that you do not group together at the back of church or outside. It is becoming increasingly obvious that the lockdown, coupled with vaccinations, is reducing infection rates. Bishop Mark is hoping to inform us of any relaxation in restrictions asap. Until we are able to return to a more normal pattern of worship, Fr Peter is available by appointment for any pastoral need. **Arrangements for Easter:** Unlike last year when Fr Peter had to celebrate the Triduum alone, we shall be able to have a congregation this year, but numbers at all services will be limited to 50, so demand will exceed supply! We have decided to have a booking system as we did at Christmas. It will be necessary to book for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday 9.00 and 11.00am. All services except Sunday 9.00am will also be streamed. Booking, for parishioners only, by email to the parish office, stmarysrcmiddlewich@gmail.com stating clearly which service you wish to attend, how many places you need & giving your phone no.. Please consider others and do not try to book for everything. **Booking will open at 12.00noon today, Saturday, 13th March and emails will be dealt with in strict order of arrival.
