


Despite the complete relaxation of the restrictions to which we have become accustomed, please do not think that this means no restrictions in church immediately. The Bishops have said that they do not envisage Sunday Masses returning to normal before Advent, but that Parish Priests should decide at what pace the restrictions should be relaxed, taking into account local conditions. However, there is increasing concern about the high numbers of cases of the virus and hospitalisations, so, in common with many other parishes, we have decided to keep the restrictions in church as they are, including the wearing of masks, signing in, the sanitising of hands, the social distancing measures, and the stewarding of weekend Masses until at least the end of August. This is disappointing, but is the only way to ensure the safety of our whole church family. Many people will be on holiday during this time so there should not be a problem with the restricted numbers. The same limit of 50 will be applied for weddings, baptisms & funerals The safety concerns mean that, unfortunately, for the time being, St Margaret's will remain closed for worship. Mothers' Prayers now takes place in church after Mass each Friday. Mass on Wednesday evenings & 11.00am Sunday will be streamed until numbers are no longer restricted, but please come in person if you can. Numbers are currently below maximum due to holidays Please tell all your fellow parishioners how safe it feels in church and encourage everyone to be part of the real, not just virtual, community again.
