

Synod – The way forward Together

What is the Synod

Pope Francis has invited the global church to a conversation about the future, and to share stories of our reality right now. We are called to dream dreams together, and he wants everyones's voice to count. The conversations we are having now are also going on all around the world, and all the findings will be discussed at a diocesan meeting next year (2022), followed by a written submission by the diocese.

As a result of the Holy Father's request we will be holding gatherings in the parish to ask all parishioners to express their views on this subject. The gatherings will be held in St Mary's parish centre and St Margaret's Chapel.

Our Parish listening gatherings

To help with our responses we are focusing on four questions which will guide us.

Our reflection questions are:

- 1. What is it like for me being a Catholic today?
- 2. What are your experiences of the Church doing something well?
- 3. What are your experiences of the Church when things have not gone well?
- 4. What are our dreams for the church?

Gatherings will be guided by parish listeners. There are a number of opportunities for you to participate:

After Holy Mass on Sundays in January / February

These sessions will last about 50 minutes and will reflect only on one / two of the four questions each week over a three week period

Evening Sessions throughout January

These will be on Zoom to help those unable to attend sessions during the day.

These sessions will last about 40 minutes and will reflect only on one / two of the four questions each week over a three week period

Half day sessions in January

These sessions will be held on a Friday / Saturday and will last about 4 hours. All four questions will be covered in these prayerful and reflective gatherings

If you are unable to attend sessions in person or via Zoom and would like to discuss the questions informally, a visit by a listener and Eucharistic minister can be arranged.



Being a Synodal Church

The practice of living as a Synodal Church means:

- The conversations lead to conversion to Christ and commitment to active participation in the mission given by Christ — Communion
- The people of God talk with one another and listen to one another about questions that matter — Participation
- The communion exists for a common purpose; mission flows naturally from the experience of communion — Mission.
