Synod Update: This week we will look at excerpts from the responses for our third reflective question: Participation: the people of God talk and listen graciously to one another about questions that matter:Q.3 What are some of your experiences of when things have not gone so well? \*More Catholic Teachers in Catholic Schools. • Sexist language enshrined in the Mass. NOT acceptable to group women under the heading of 'man; men; mankind'. Outdated and offensive • 2014 Synod on the Family. What has changed? There was a question about married priests. What happened to that? Ignored? Blocked? • Lack of women in "higher level" roles. Sense of inequality - eg: allowing married anglicans to convert to the priesthood. The need for clarity in the decision making process. Laity feel a lack of explanation on such matters which can be misleading and lead to a lack of understanding and frustration. Difficulty sometimes experienced by some wanting to become Catholic because of marriage and divorce complications. Difficult for RCIA catechists when someone with all their heart wants to participate in the sacramental life. • Perceived attitude of the church, especially in the media, on issues such as homosexuality, abortion rights, end of life issues. More clarification from the "top" to put the loving, caring ministry of the Catholic church at the forefront when explaining the Church's stance on such important issues. Offering solutions and walking alongside everyone, especially when they are facing such issues and offering practical help, perhaps promoting adoption etc. as an alternative solution. • More transparency over the serious issues of child abuse within the Catholic Church - accountability and acknowledgment of past/ current transgressions. • We fail young people in the community by not providing enough clubs or team social events in a Catholic context. Next week we will look at our dreams for the future of our church.

In the end, the goal of this synodal process is to see what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. Walking the synodal path brings us towards deeper communion, greater participation, and more robust missionary spirit. The Synod is an invitation for the Church at all levels to be formed in a spirit of synodality, to grow and learn as the People of God, and in so doing, become the "pilgrim Church" it is meant to be. As we reflect on our experiences of the synod so far, we should now start to look beyond the listening phase.
