Synod Update: This week we have selected excerpts from the responses to our fourth reflective question: What are our dreams for the Church?

To be an organisation promoting love and acceptance throughout the world - being open and welcoming to all. Somewhere that people feel drawn to in a positive way. • Ordained women, female deacons, married priests • Take down the barriers, perceived barriers, to allow those Christians searching the Catholic faith to understand our traditions and masses in a more accessible way. Have outstanding Catholic education in every community with a vouth focused chaplain in every school supporting our youth beyond the basic sacraments • Regional events like the World Youth Day but done on a Deanery level with no barriers to access. • The laity has to come forward to share the load in parish life. • We should celebrate more in the style of New Dawn and Walsingham, bring New Dawn celebrating to the parish ... Both religious and laity need to consider how we conduct ourselves and the language that we use to ensure that the universal church is more inclusive no matter what your lifestyle, sexual orientation or mindset; maybe we should encourage more involvement and inclusiveness at a local level in every parish. • There was one glaring omission about the "outsiders", that the Church needs to be more open to, and that is the divorced, separated and the re-married. • Social events to be held in a Catholic context would encourage all in the community to attend and participate.

Our Next Steps:To continue the listening and dialogue beyond this process with our priest and deacons in order to develop a local parish plan. All parishioners, including Synodal participants, will be invited to form a Synod steering group to develop and implement our parish plan. Passover Meal: What is it? First off, it's a Jewish family celebration of the Exodus from Egypt and as with all good celebrations there is food and drink! A cooked meal is provided but bring your own wine (preferably red but will let you get away with white or grape juice/ribena etc) It has many ritual elements that are a memorial to us oldies and a teaching to the younger members of families about God freeing the Israelites from captivity in Egypt, the Angel passing over the houses of the captive Israelites and inflicting the 10 plagues on the Egyptians and the crossing of the Red Sea to freedom. For us as Christians we are reminded of what Jesus and his disciples did at the last supper, and his institution of the Holy Eucharist. It is a fun, social evening with a prayerful side. There is a suggested donation of £8 per adult, £5 per child to cover the cost of the food. Any surplus will be added to our covid-depleted parish funds!
