Dear Friends,

This Sunday in Ordinary Time directs our attention to God's intention for the salvation of the human race in Jesus Christ. In a word, everyone is called to God's Kingdom. So, the Good News of Christ must be preached and believed, and of course should be lived by all from North, East, West and South (News).

Salvation, though, cannot be bought, inherited or stolen, but simply gained by a life of doing God's will and living under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity. Anything good worth having implies an effort in attaining. It is no different in our life in Christ. The worst mistake on the spiritual path is to become complacent, presuming we are "home safe," simply by having been baptized and confirmed. These are important steps in the pilgrim way to God, but the spiritual life has to be cultivated, lived out day by day. In that spiritual life we will face many trials and challenges which make our path very narrow. But we need to stay the path, persevere and proceed ahead to be successful in our journey to God-in-Person.
