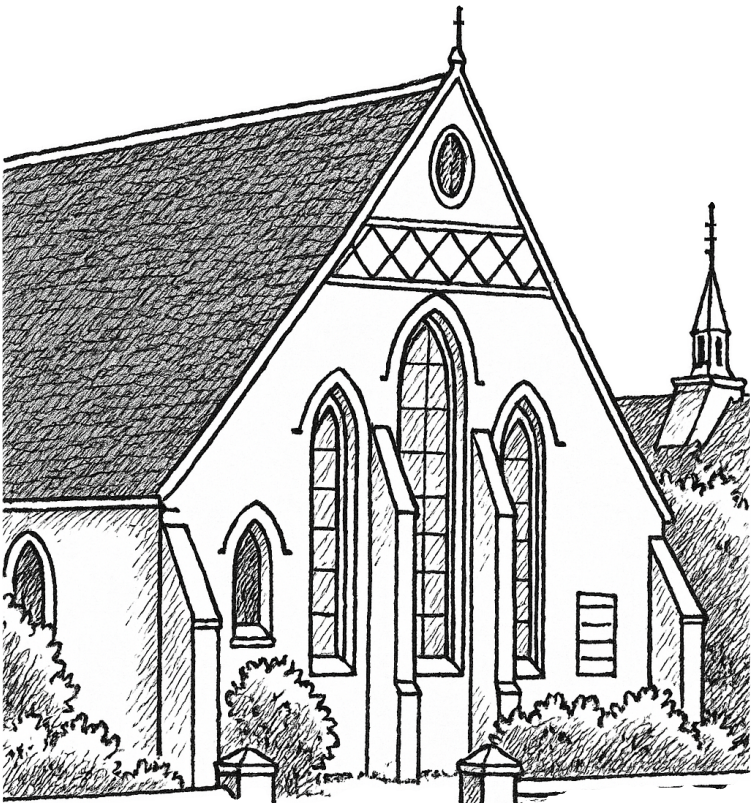

Fr. Vijay's reflection

Today Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount with words that turn the world upside down. The Beatitudes are not a list of achievements, but a portrait of the kind of heart God blesses – the humble, the gentle, the merciful, the seekers of peace. These blessings reveal a God who draws close to those who struggle and lifts up those the world overlooks.
In a culture that prizes strength, success, and self reliance, Jesus invites us to discover a deeper happiness rooted in trust, compassion, and simplicity of heart. The Beatitudes are both comfort and challenge: comfort for those who feel small or weary, and challenge for those called to live God's mercy more boldly.
As we enter this new week, may we allow Christ's words to shape our attitudes, soften our responses, and widen our compassion. Blessed are we when we walk the path of the Kingdom with humility and hope.

GOOD NEWS FROM CAFOD

Restrictive seed laws overturned: Kenyan farmers' rights restored

After years of campaigning, a group of farmers supported by civil society organisations, including CAFOD’s partner BIBA Kenya, has successfully challenged Kenya’s seed laws that criminalised farmers for saving their own seeds. This sets a positive precedent to challenge similar laws in other countries.

The ruling means that, without fear of prosecution, farmers in Kenya are now free to:

- save their own seeds
- share seeds within their communities
- exchange and sell farmer varieties
- strengthen farmer-managed seed systems.

CAFOD's own Fix the Food System campaign (which we have supported as a parish) has been working to put an end to regressive seeds laws that restrict - or even criminalise - smallholder farmers' access to their own variety of seeds. During 2026 CAFOD will continue to stand with their partners as they challenge these seeds laws.
